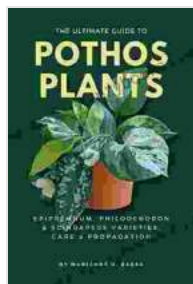

## Troubleshooting Common Problems

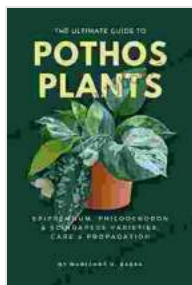
