

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



| Alliteration | Allusion |
| Another name for alliteration is tongue twisters; one after the other share the first few, initial consonant sounds. E.g. She sells seashells on the seashore. | Every time you make a reference to some places, events, or a person you are making an allusion. E.g. I'm not Sherlock Holmes to figure that out. |
| Amplification | Analogy |
| Repeating the same word one after the other, combined with an adjective or two makes it seems stronger, more significant. E.g. His face is red, so so red. | Sometimes the easiest way to explain things is to strike a parallel with some other thing that is quite similar to it E.g. She is as pale as a ghost. |
| Anaphora | Antanagoge |
| Anaphora is defined as repeating a single word or a phrase in successive phrases. E.g. Some glory in their birth, some in their skill, some in their wealth. | An antanagoge is when you combine a positive and a negative statement together E.g. This summer season was dry, but not as dry as the one back in 2012. |
| Antimetabole | Antiphrasis |
| Repeating words in verse order is what antimetabole is all about. E.g. Eat to live, not live to eat. | This device is used for ironic, sarcastic and humoristic effect. It usually makes fun of opposites. E.g. A really ugly painting, such a Mona Lisa, or a very slow person, Usain Bolt. |
| Antithesis | Appositive |
| Any time you make a connection between two events, people or things you are using this rhetorical device E.g. Love, is ideal, marriage real. | If you want to describe a noun better, with another noun, you are using appositive E.g. Alexander of Macedonia, master general. |
| Enumeratio | Enumeration is when you try to make some sort of point by numbering things one after the other. E.g. The salesgirl lists every feature the item has in an attempt to make you agree with them |





there is none like You lots, because mighty words have been uttered by others. There is rest in this associating myself with an innumerable multitude who have "cried to God and been answered." This petition in Psalms 86:1 is like that in Psalms 55:2; Psalms 86:2 would be a reminiscence of Psalms 25:20; Psalms 86:3 closely resembles Psalms 57:1.

The *petitions* on which the petitions are grounded are also *inseparably* connected together. First, the psalmist asks to be heard because he is afflicted and poor, (compare Psalms 13:17) Our need is a valid plea with a faithful God. The sense of it drives us to Him; and our recognition of poverty will always underlie all faithful appeal to Him. The second plea is capable of two interpretations. The psalmist says that he is *Christ*; and that word is by some commentators taken to mean one who exercises, and by others, one who is the subject of, Christ-like, being-like-ness. As has been already remarked on Psalms 62, the passive meaning—i.e., one whom God's loving-kindness is shown—is preferable. Here it is distinctly better than the other. The psalmist is not presenting his own character as a plea, but urging God's gracious relation to him, which, once entered on, pleads God in unchanging confluence in manifesting His loving-kindness. But though the psalmist does not plead his character, he does, in the subsequent pleas, present his faith, his duty and day-long prayer, and his lifting of his quiesce, aspiration, and relate itself above the trivialities of earth to set them in God. These are valid pleas with Him. It cannot be that trust fixed on His *sheep-like* dispositions, nor that cries perpetually rising to His ears should be unanswered, nor that a soul striking its tendons here and there should fail to find the strong stay, round which it can cling and clasp. God yields the force of such appeals, and delights to be moved to answer, by the spreading history of His creature's faith and longings.

Notes—

I. The invocations. They form in these various ways but one the Psalms invoke God, and that by three several names: "Dybowk," "My God," "Lord," ("Jehovah.") The word implies strength, number being, undivided self-existence. It was given as the seal of the covenant, at the ground of the great deliverance from Egyptian bondage. The national existence rested upon it. The vitality of Israel was guaranteed by the stability of Yahweh's God. (10 "My God.") The word implies the abounding and fulness of power, and so may be found, and often is found, in the lips of heathens. It connotes the omnipotence rather than the moral excellence or covenant relation of God as the ground of our hopes. This general conception becomes special to the Psalmist chiefly by the little word which he prefix to it, "my God." (10) The word "Lord" is not, as a mere English reader might suppose, the same word as that which is preferred "Lord" in the first verse. That is, "Jehowah." This means just what English word "Lord" means. It conveys the general idea of authority and dominion.

II. The petitions which follow these given. They are all substantially the same, and so they are very probably how familiar all the aspects of the following that the reader should know them well. (10) There is, first, the cry that God would hear, the basis of all the following, and there is a threefold description of the persons of distinction. Verbatim, "Hear my cry" "my mortal." Then there is a longing for that which cannot be fully expressed.


